God Chose You... What Will You Choose?

Now when those hired first came, they thought they would receive more, but each of them also received a denarius. ¹¹ And on receiving it they grumbled at the master of the house, ¹² saying, 'These last worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat.' ¹³ But he replied to one of them, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong. Did you not agree with me for a denarius? ¹⁴ Take what belongs to you and go. I choose to give to this last worker as I give to you. ¹⁵ Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or do you begrudge my generosity?' ¹⁶ So the last will be first, and the first last." (Matt. 20:10-16 ESV)

My fellow Children of God, you've been chosen to be his child. God has elected to send his Son to suffer, die, and rise again so that you may have hope for the future and live in His love forever. These are not empty words or a campaign slogan, this is the promise of the gospel, that by grace through Faith in our Lord Jesus Christ we are saved.

For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹ nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Rom. 8:37-39 ESV)

You may have noticed that we are in the heart of election season. If that makes you cringe a little, I'm not surprised. Maybe, you aren't happy with the candidates. Perhaps you are afraid of the results. You might even be afraid that life as we know it will cease to exist if a particular candidate is elected. Yet even it that were to happen, isn't it amazing that by the grace of God we can live every moment of our present life and circumstances with hearts of joy and thankfulness.

What's that you say? What if some known or hidden threat to democracy takes it all down? What if my freedom of speech is taken away? My prayer is that whether things continue as they have, get better, worse, we are all thrown into prison or yes even die for our faith, our last words and actions, and those leading up to them, will be to the glory of God, share the gospel, and hold fast to the hope of Romans 8.

Don't get me wrong. I do believe that it is our duty as Christians to be on guard, to seek to be good citizens, and to encourage whatever government leaders we live under to seek God's will and follow it. I also believe that our most important role as Christian citizens is to recognize that the most important changes in society come through the change of hearts. Only God can change hearts. However, he can work powerfully though our words and actions to point others toward God and model for others what it means to have faith, hope, love, joy, peace, kindness, gentleness, self-control, and so many other Christian attitudes and behaviors that I so often see lacking in our conversations and actions today. I wonder what do our attitudes sometimes look like toward those believers and servants of God who are new to the party or with whom we still have disagreements as times? How can we better handle our different approaches, preferred ways of doing things, and yes even times when correction is needed based on the word of God? During this "election season" as God calls out to his chosen children, seeking to gather together those he has elected to serve in his kingdom, what would it look like for us to be more thankful and Christlike? Could it be something like this?

These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full. ¹² "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. ¹³ Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command you. ¹⁵ No longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you. ¹⁶ You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you. ¹⁷ These things I command you, so that you will love one another. (Jn. 15:11-17 ESV)
